BUSINESS EV CHARGER INCENTIVES

City Light may cover up to 100% of eligible charging infrastructure costs. Funding is first-come, first-served, and site caps reset annually.

- **Tier 1 Incentives:** Large businesses and nonprofits, public (government) entities located outside of overburdened communities*, and Fortune 500 companies.
- **Tier 2 Incentives:** Small businesses and nonprofits, women- and minority-owned businesses (WMBEs), tribal entities, and entities located within overburdened communities*.

*Overburdened communities are census tracts with a rank of 9 or higher on the [Washington State Department of Health's Environmental Health Disparities Map](#).

Key Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a City Light commercial account holder or customer.
- Applications must be submitted before construction is complete — retroactive applications are not accepted.
- Level 2 and DCFC equipment must be listed on the City Light EPRI Vetted Product List (epri.com/vpl).
- Level 2 and DCFC equipment must track data via a network on the City Light EPRI VPL or a dedicated City Light meter.
