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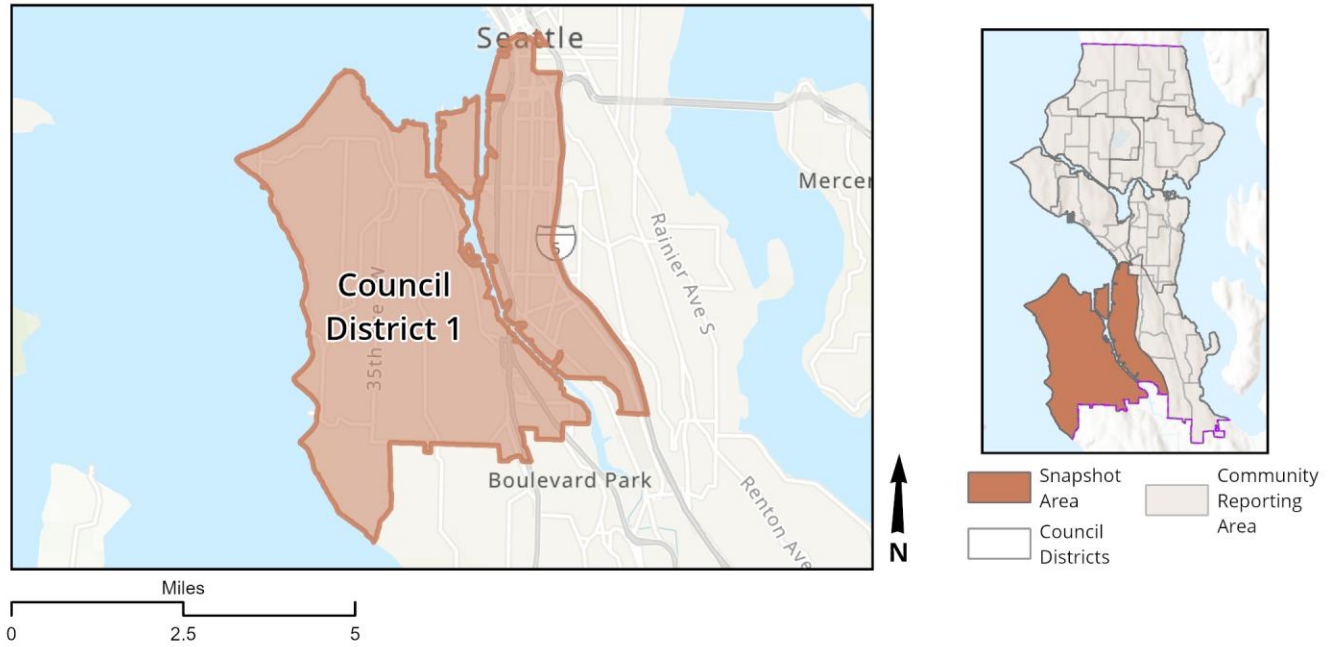
Introduction

The Office of Planning & Community Development produces a Neighborhood Snapshot for each of the 53 Community Reporting Areas in Seattle. We also produce a District Snapshot for each of the seven Council Districts in the city. Each of these areas has both a graphic-rich version of the Snapshot and an expanded, accessible version of the Snapshot. The Snapshots for Community Reporting Areas are available online at [Neighborhood Snapshots](#), while the Snapshots for Council Districts are online at [Council District Snapshots](#).

This document is the expanded, accessible version of the Snapshot for Council District 1. We designed the accessible version to respond to guidelines for making information on the Web accessible to help meet requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Like the graphic-rich version, this version includes data for both the Council District and Seattle to enable users to understand this area in context of the city as a whole. *This version additionally provides comparison data for King County, Washington state, and the United States.* This document presents the Snapshot data in two sections.

- **The first section uses tables to present most of the data in the Snapshot.** We recommend that people using a screen reader skip to the narrative section described and bookmarked below.
- **The second section uses narrative to present the data in the Snapshot tables** to help make the information easier to understand with use of a screen reader. Narrative

Area Description

Figure 1 provides a pair of small maps, with the map on the left showing the boundaries of the Council District and the map on the right showing its location within Seattle. The following narrative describes the Council District in more detail.

From the southwest boundary of city at the extension of Seola Beach Drive Southwest into Puget Sound, north and east along the west boundary of city in Puget Sound and into Elliott Bay to Colman Dock approximately 200 feet north of Yesler Way, then east along Colman Dock to Alaskan Way, then northwest on Alaskan Way to Columbia Street, then northeast on Columbia Street to 2nd Avenue, then southeast on 2nd Avenue to Cherry Street, then northeast on Cherry Street to 3rd Avenue, then southeast on 3rd Avenue to James Street, then northeast on James Street to 4th Avenue, then southeast on 4th Avenue to Jefferson Street, then northeast on Jefferson Street to 6th Avenue, then northwest on 6th Avenue to James Street, then northeast on James Street to Interstate 5, then southeast on Interstate 5 to Yesler Way, then west on Yesler Way to 4th Avenue South, then south on 4th Avenue South to Seattle Boulevard South, then southeast on Seattle Boulevard to South Dearborn Street, then east on South Dearborn Street to Interstate 5, then south on Interstate 5 to the south boundary of city, then west along the south boundary of city to origin.

Community Reporting Areas are combinations of census tracts used by the City to summarize neighborhood-level data published by the U.S. Census Bureau. Because they are based on census geographies, Community Reporting Areas may not match local ideas of neighborhood boundaries. If a Snapshot does not show enough of the area you're interested in, please look at Snapshots for adjoining areas.

About the Data

The population size and growth statistics in the Snapshots come from the Washington State Office of Financial Management (OFM) and U.S. Census Bureau's decennial census. At the city-level these statistics are from OFM's April 1 intercensal estimates for 2010-2019 and April 1 official estimates for 2020-2025, while the statistics for other geographies in Washington are based on OFM's annual April 1 [Small Area Estimates](#).

Unless otherwise stated, data on population and household characteristics are from the [American Community Survey](#) 2024 5-Year Estimates published by the U.S. Census Bureau. The list of neighborhood languages is based on a combination of data from the American Community Survey and Seattle Public Schools' Home Language Survey. Five years of American Community Survey data are pooled for estimates at a neighborhood level. Even then, margins of error for American Community Survey estimates can be substantial. Some characteristics in the Snapshots are for a subset of the population.
