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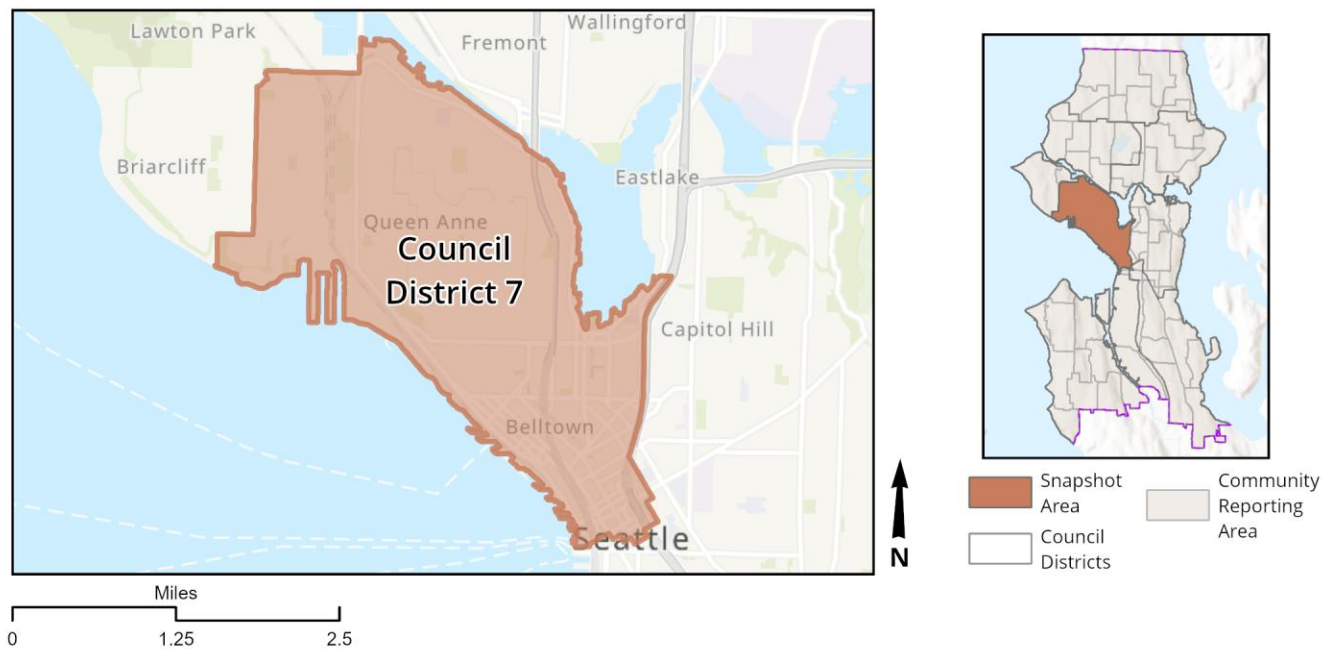
Introduction

The Office of Planning & Community Development produces a Neighborhood Snapshot for each of the 53 Community Reporting Areas in Seattle. We also produce a District Snapshot for each of the seven Council Districts in the city. Each of these areas has both a graphic-rich version of the Snapshot and an expanded, accessible version of the Snapshot. The Snapshots for Community Reporting Areas are available online at [Neighborhood Snapshots](#), while the Snapshots for Council Districts are online at [Council District Snapshots](#).

This document is the expanded, accessible version of the Snapshot for Council District 7. We designed the accessible version to respond to guidelines for making information on the Web accessible to help meet requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Like the graphic-rich version, this version includes data for both the Council District and Seattle to enable users to understand this area in context of the city as a whole. *This version additionally provides comparison data for King County, Washington state, and the United States.* This document presents the Snapshot data in two sections.

- **The first section uses tables to present most of the data in the Snapshot.** We recommend that people using a screen reader skip to the narrative section described and bookmarked below.
- **The second section uses narrative to present the data in the Snapshot tables** to help make the information easier to understand with use of a screen reader. Narrative

Area Description

Figure 1 provides a pair of small maps, with the map on the left showing the boundaries of the Council District and the map on the right showing its location within Seattle. The following narrative describes the Council District in more detail.

From Elliott Bay to Colman Dock approximately 200 feet north of Yesler Way along the western city boundary to the 32nd Avenue West Street End, then north on 32nd Avenue West to West Howe Street, then east on West Howe Street to 28th Avenue West, then north on 28th Avenue West to West Manor Place, then northeast on West Manor Place to 27th Place West, then north on 27th Place West to West Emerson Street, then east on West Emerson Street and line connecting West Emerson Street sections to 24th Avenue West, then south on 24th Avenue West to West Emerson Street, then east on West Emerson Street and line connecting West Emerson Street sections to 15th Avenue West, then north on 15th Avenue West to the Lake Washington Ship Canal, then east along the Lake Washington Ship Canal to Lake Union, then southeast in Lake Union to waterway south of Lake Union Drydock at Fairview Avenue North, then northeast on Fairview Avenue North to Eastlake Avenue East, then continuing east on East Galer Street to Interstate 5, then south on Interstate 5 to 9th Avenue line, then southeast on the line connecting Interstate 5 and 9th Avenue to University Street, then southeast on 9th Avenue to Marion Street, then southwest on Marion Street to 8th Avenue, then southwest on 8th Avenue to James Street, then southwest on James Street to 6th Avenue, then southeast on 6th Avenue to Jefferson Street, then southwest on Jefferson Street to 4th Avenue, then northwest on 4th Avenue to James Street, then southwest on James Street to 3rd Avenue, then northwest on 3rd Avenue to Cherry Street, then southwest on Cherry Street to 2nd Avenue, then northwest on 2nd Avenue to Columbia Street, then southwest on Columbia to Alaskan Way, then south on Alaskan Way to Colman Dock and origin.

The Office of Planning and Community Development produces and periodically updates the Snapshots for all **53 Community Reporting Areas** and **seven Council Districts**. The Snapshots provide basic data about the population and demographic characteristics in each area and include comparison data for broader geographies.

Community Reporting Areas are combinations of census tracts used by the City to summarize neighborhood-level data published by the U.S. Census Bureau. Because they are based on census geographies, Community Reporting Areas may not match local ideas of neighborhood boundaries. If a Snapshot does not show enough of the area you're interested in, please look at Snapshots for adjoining areas.

About the Data

The population size and growth statistics in the Snapshots come from the Washington State Office of Financial Management (OFM) and U.S. Census Bureau's decennial census. At the city-level these statistics are from OFM's April 1 intercensal estimates for 2010-2019 and April 1 official estimates for 2020-2025, while the statistics for other geographies in Washington are based on OFM's annual April 1 [Small Area Estimates](#).

Unless otherwise stated, data on population and household characteristics are from the [American Community Survey](#) 2024 5-Year Estimates published by the U.S. Census Bureau. The list of neighborhood languages is based on a combination of data from the American Community Survey and Seattle Public Schools' Home Language Survey. Five years of American Community Survey data are pooled for estimates at a neighborhood level. Even then, margins of error for American Community Survey estimates can be substantial. Some characteristics in the Snapshots are for a subset of the population.
