



2018 SBC Code Interpretation

SBC 705.2, CA 705.2
Regulation of Covered Balconies

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The following interpretation, policy or code alternate is intended to provide guidance to staff for consistency of review and is subject to change without notice. Application of this interpretation, policy or code alternate to specific projects may vary.

Code Issue:

Are covered balconies regulated as floor area or projections by the building code?
What is the code impact of being considered floor area?

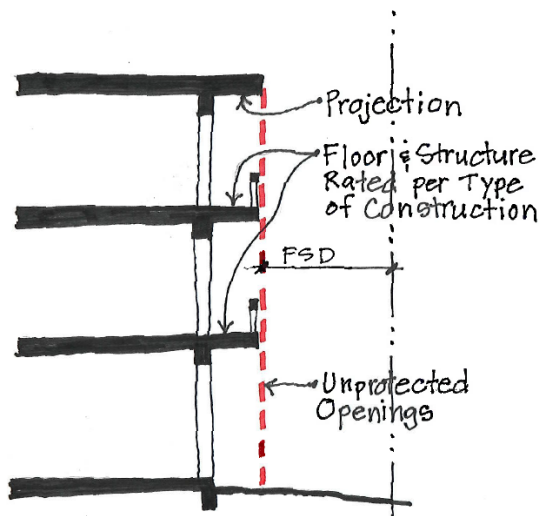
Interpretation:

Covered balconies are treated as floor area, not projections. This interpretation is based on the definitions of gross floor area and building area which both stipulate that “areas of the building not provided with surrounding exterior walls...under the horizontal projection of the roof or floor or above” shall be included as part of the building area or floor area.

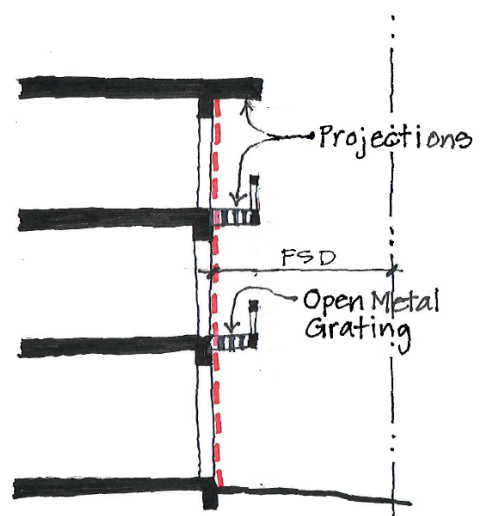
Note: All balconies, covered and uncovered, can be considered projections where they comply with Code Alternate CA 705.2.

Covered balconies being treated as floor area, must comply with the following:

- **Fire-resistance rating of floor and supporting structure:** Floor and supporting structure need to have fire-resistance rating as required by the Type of Construction.
- **Fire separation distance:** Fire separation distance is measured from the vertical plane at the outermost edge of the balcony.
- **Unprotected openings:** Open sides of balconies are considered unprotected openings and must conform to the allowable percentage of openings in Table 705.8.
- **Unit separation:** Unit Separation as required by SBC 420.2 must extend to the outermost edge of the balconies.
